This is an accredited training position, working towards fellowship of the RCPA or dual training for the combined fellowship for the RCPA and RACP. We are accredited for 6 months core laboratory training over a 12 month term for a dual RCPA/RACP trainee or 12 months for an immunopathology RCPA only trainee.

Trainees will be expected to be preparing for the Part I and II Immunopathology examinations of the RCPA and participate in educational activities as such.
